Nursery:

It has been lovely to welcome all of the children back this week, we are hoping to see some signs of Spring arriving over the next few weeks.

Our book for this week has been 'Superworm' – we have been using our fine motor skills to pick up wiggly worms with pegs and counting how many we could find. We worked together to think of lots of 'wow' words to describe Superworm.





On Tuesday, we celebrated pancake day and made pancakes with all of the children, carefully measuring and mixing the ingredients before sitting down to enjoy them as a class.

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Reception

What a fantastic first week back! Ash Tree and Oak Tree class have had a very exciting few days as we have been making pancakes. The children listened brilliantly and followed the instructions for how to make a pancake. They even had a go at flipping their pancake in the air!

We then had a go at designing a pancake for Mr Wolf, who was very greedy and ate all of the pancakes and his neighbours! Finally we learnt a pancake song and performed it in Recognition Assembly in front of the rest of the school - we were amazing. Well done for a great first week back!



Year 1/2

This week we have begun to learn about castles. At forest school, the

children used their knowledge of castle features to construct their own castles with mud and other natural resources. In Maths, Year 2 have been making equal groups; multiplying and dividing and Year 1 have been exploring bar models and using number rods to calculate the missing number.



Year 2 have enjoyed learning about castles this week in preparation for our school trip next week to Oxford Castle. We

have been looking at a fact file, a non-fiction text all about castles and in history we worked together to draw our own castles. We had to send one person from each group to go and take a quick look at the castle picture outside and then they had to come back in and draw the part of the castle they went to look at until we finished drawing. Our final



drawings are fantastic! We also did a little bit of research about castles on the iPads in our groups.

In maths we have been looking at multiplication and division and have enjoyed our practical learning outside; chalking on the floor and inside; writing on the tables.



Year 3:










It has been lovely to welcome back Maple Tree Class after our half term break. We have been exploring the book Fantastic Mr Fox, looking at the structure of the story, character descriptions, and building tension in our writing. This has been a really nice link to our topic 'What Lies Beneath' - a classic fiction story focusing on a fox and his family who live underground who have conflicts with three local farmers. Speaking of what lies beneath, for Design Technology, we have begun making 3D models of volcanoes to further link the knowledge gained on the learning journey of this topic. In Maths, we have looked at relating calculations such as $3 \times 2 = 6$ and $3 \times 20 = 60$ which has allowed the children to make links within the maths. Finally, the much-anticipated Forest School sessions have returned. This week the children looked at building nests and other facilities for birds to support them in a nurturing way. Please remember to bring waterproofs and wellies for next week!

Governor profile—Aaron Nelson


