

Reception:



Reception have enjoyed looking at the book "Quest" by Aaron Becker this week and have thought of lots of different ways they could travel around. We even had a camper van created using the large loose parts in the outdoor area!







We enjoyed taking part in our Forest School session, looking for lots of different flowers and creating beautiful flower collages.

Year 1/Year 2:What a fun time we've had in Beech tree class these last two weeks! We were lucky enough to take part in a Martial Arts workshop last week. We learned about discipline and safety whilst practising controlled movements. We all had so much fun and lots of us wanted to sign up for classes after school! In English, we've been focusing on our





ESR (Education for Social Responsibility) topic about local wildlife. Mrs Cannings and Mrs Christmas are really proud of our ambitious writing! We've also had lots of fun in science where we've been growing cress in different environments and dissecting seeds.



Pine Tree class have enjoyed exploring their new outdoor area this week. They have explored numbers up to 100 by playing a range of games. They particularly enjoyed snakes and ladders and they played a game called 'inbetweenies' where they ordered 3 numbers from smallest to largest, then selected a card and had to put the card in the correct place.



Year 2 began their investigation in science this week where they are investigating what will happen to a bean seed if it doesn't get what it needs to help it grow. They planted a seed in different pots and only one pot has soil, water and the right temperature. The other pots have 1 thing missing in each pot. We made predictions and are looking forward to seeing what happens to each seed.





Year 3: Maple tree class have begun exploring how to make model roundhouses using natural materials. This is in preparation for writing non-chronological reports about the evolution of homes in Britain. For this, we will compare houses from the stone age to those made during the Roman, Tudor and Victorian periods. For maths, we have been learning to convert pounds and pence, adding money and subtracting money. In PSHE, we are using this term to reflect on the year that has passed by recognising







our achievements and considering goals for the future. The children have thought carefully about what has been crucial in achieving their accomplishments and how these steps can be used for further goals.

Finally, preparations have begun for the Y3 production which is called 'Eruption: The Story of The Stone Age and Romans'. The children have started learning their parts and songs with the performance to Y3 parents taking place on **Wednesday 19th July at 2pm.**

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
