What a busy first week in Apple Tree Class! The children have all demonstrated our school value 'Be Adventurous', coming in to a new environment and meeting different people. They have enjoyed joining in with 'Dear Zoo' and we have been learning some new songs and how to get along with others. The children have had some lovely ideas in their play and we have enjoyed getting to know them. We have also been drawing our 'self portraits' to display on their 'wow' board in the classroom – we can't wait for you to see them!



Reception :

What a fantastic first week of school Ash Tree and Oak Tress have had. The children have loved exploring their new classrooms and outdoor area, making the most of the sunshine! We had two jumping visitors in our garden - frogs! The children were very excited and we carefully put them in a box and set them free down by the stream at school.

This week we have been focusing on friendship and thinking about how we can be a kind friend. The children have been very independent and responsible by collecting their lunch and clearing their own plates, lining up when they hear the bells at lunch time and tidying their classrooms at the end of the day. Ash Tree and Oak Tree, we are very proud of you for a lovely first week at Badbury Park!

Key Stage 1 (Beech, Pine, Yew and Maple)



Yew and Maple Tree classes have had a fantastic start to Year 2! We have been working hard to learn our poem ready for our very first poetry slam! Year 2s in Maple Tree have enjoyed exploring their new upstairs classroom whilst Year 2s in Yew Tree have been exploring their new classroom downstairs. We used the outdoors to inspire our writing this week and have started looking at numbers to 100 in maths. We are excited to start focusing on our topic 'Ancient Egyptians' and have already been learning about this in History.

Pine and Beech tree classes have had a wonderful start and Mrs Cannings, Mrs Stutt and Miss Ahmed have been very impressed by how brilliantly we have settled into Year 1. We've learnt lots of new songs and games, and we have been working hard on our Poetry Slam competition entry - The Figment Tree by Roger McGough. In Maths we've been recapping our knowledge of number and shape and ways to sort objects and numbers which they have enjoyed. What a fantastic start to the year!.



Key Stage 2 (Maple, Hazel and Willow) Hazel Tree class and Maple Tree have had a fantastic start to Year 3! We have been working hard to learn our poem ready for our very first poetry slam! We have enjoyed exploring our new upstairs classrooms as well as getting outside to inspire our writing in English and practising writing numbers in words in Maths. We've started to look at our new topic 'Ancient' Egyptians' in History and have been learning the names of our bones in Science.



We were very excited to begin Spanish this week and started off with learning different greetings.

Wow! What a start to the year we have had in Willow Class! As the eldest children in the school, Willow Class have taken part in a special Blue Kite writing project. To celebrate Julia Donaldson's 75th birthday we had 250 characters to write the next part of a Gruffalo story and pass it on to the next school. Miss Horrobin was delighted with our entry and we cannot wait to discover the twists

and turns that are added by the subsequent schools when the project is complete. And the excitement did not end there because then we rehearsed the poem 'Scissors' by Allan Ahlberg for our very first Badbury Park Poetry slam judged by a special panel of judges! In maths, we have been busy working with place value in particular partitioning numbers up to 1,000 using the correct place value language and showing off our understanding of number through manipulating concrete base 10 resources too. During computing we started to look at how information in distributed through switches and routers! Here we are passing information though the switch in an internal network and making sure we project our voices for the SLAM.





Helpful Reminders for the Start of the New Academic Year

<u>Water and snacks</u>: Please can we remind parents again that your child's water bottle should contain **plain tap water**, not juice, squash or flavoured water. School provides a piece of fruit at break time for all Y2, Y1 and YR. Y3 and Y4 may bring in a piece of fruit from home – no other snacks are permitted

<u>Naming your child's property:</u> Please ensure that your child's name is clearly visible on everything including all clothing, water bottles, shoes and even scooters.



<u>Coats:</u> Please can you make sure your child brings a named waterproof coat and jumper to school EVERY DAY as the weather is very changeable and children will spend some time every day outside whatever the weather.

Absence and attendance: Swindon Borough Council review our attendance data very closely, with a particular focus on unauthorised absence, and specific action is taken where attendance is below 95%. Any holiday taken in term time will not be authorised and a fine may be issued, particularly if your child already has any unauthorised absence. The only time a child may be absent from school is under exceptional circumstances - cost, employment, extended family illnesses and extended family gatherings are **not** deemed as exceptional circumstances.

There are only 190 statutory school days in one year and 175 days (weekends and school holidays) available to use for holidays. Therefore EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS!

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason you should call the school office before 09.00am on the first day of absence. You will need to either provide a return date for your child or contact the office on each morning of your child's absence. Any unexplained absence will be registered as unauthorised. You will be asked to provide proof of appointments.

<u>Collection</u>: Please let the staff member on duty know if your child is going home with someone else. If pick up arrangements change during the day, please advise the office **by midday** We will not let your child go home



with anyone we are not expecting to collect or who is not listed as a contact. **Mobile phones**: We would ask parents not to use their mobile phones on the school site whilst

dropping off or collecting children. As well as being a safeguarding issue, it has a big impact if you greet your child with a smile and take a moment to listen and talk to them at the end of the day.

Packed lunch and allergies: We encourage healthy eating in school and would ask you to refer to the "healthy lunch" policy on the school website. We have some children and staff with allergies in school – to nuts and milk. We are **a nut free school** and no nuts of any kind are to be brought into school. Thank you.

<u>Communication</u> Our main communication method is via email; all newsletters will be emailed out and put on the school website. If you change your email address please let the office know.



<u>Cool Milk</u> Your child has been registered with Cool Milk. Once they are 5 you will need to register and pay for milk online if you would like your child to continue having a carton at snack time.

<u>Birthdays/Celebrations</u> As a healthy school and due to allergies, please could we ask that children do not bring sweets or cakes in for their birthdays. We will celebrate the children's birthdays with them in school and sing to them as a class.



Lines of communication

In order to ensure parental queries are addressed promptly, we would like to clarify lines of communication within school.

If you have a query related to your child, in the first instance this should be communicated to your child's class teacher. The class teacher knows your child best and is the one who spends every day with them in class.

If your query is not resolved, or you are concerned about the outcome, your query should then be taken to Mrs Debono and then Mrs Dance. If you have a query or concern around special needs, your query should be addressed to Mrs Christmas.

Please contact the School Office <u>admin@badburypark.bluekitetrust.org</u> to make an appointment with a member of staff, ensuring this line of communication is followed. We understand that there are instances where parents may wish to speak to other members of staff regarding other areas of school. Please contact the School Office who will be able to put parents into contact with the appropriate staff member.

Road Safety and Parking

Some of you may have seen members of Swindon Borough Council visiting school yesterday morning. Since the school opened we have had concerns about the safety of children on Rainscombe road and parking outside the school. As part of the Schools Safe Environment Zones (SSEZ) the council are considering introducing new parking restrictions on Rainscombe Road and have opened a Traffic Regulation Order, details of which can be viewed via the link below:

Comments and outcomes from the meeting this morning will be fed back to Ward Councillors before a decision is made as to whether to proceed to a formal consultation. We will keep you informed of any changes as soon as we are made aware ourselves.

In the meantime, to ensure everyone's safety and in consideration of our neighbours, could we please ask that you:

- Consider parking on Homington Avenue and walking the rest of the way to school (walking to school is a great way to become healthier and can positively contribute to a child's development)
- Always reverse into spaces at the front of the school
- Do not park in the first 3 spaces unless you are a blue badge holder
- Avoid walking on the path behind parked cars or down the centre of the road
- Do not block driveways or double park even for a few minutes
- Do not park on corners to maintain a clear view for those crossing the road
- Do not park in such a way as to block the road and prevent emergency vehicle access
- · Do not sit in the parking area with your engine running
- Do not park on pavements or kerbs in such a way which prevents pedestrians, disabled users or parents with buggies from using the pavement
- Never to stop on Zig Zag lines even for a few minutes





Have your circumstances changed? Your child may now be eligible for benefit related free school meals and we would encourage you to apply via the Swindon Borough Council website : https://

Please note that if you have older children, who are entitled to free school meals, this does not automatically register younger children onto free school meals register, you will need to apply separately for them.

Please remember that you can apply for this benefit even if your child is receiving Universal Free School Meals in YR, Y1 and Y2.
