Dear Families,

Attendance Matters



As you know your child's attendance at school is extremely important and is directly linked to their overall attainment. We take attendance and absence very seriously and continue to aim for 96%-100% attendance. Your child's attendance is reviewed regularly and where there is a concern you will be contacted next week.

I have received a flurry of pupil absence requests this week. Holiday requested during term time is not authorised and will be liable for a fine issued by Swindon Borough Council. If children are away for a continuous period of longer than 20 days they may lose their school place. #### **Nursery**

This week we have started our PE lessons in the hall; we used the parachute and took it in turns to hold it for friends to run underneath

We have been practising 'same' and 'different', making patterns of different colours and talking about what we notice.

We have also been exploring our senses; we matched different scents to pictures, thinking about what it reminds us of. The children have also looked at Colour Monster emotions thinking about how we feel and what we can do to help each other.











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#### **Reception:**

We have been very busy in Ash Tree and Oak Tree class. The Phonics Fairy arrived in our classrooms, left us a letter and each day has been leaving a story and a new sound to learn. The children have written notes to the Phonics Fairy and drew pictures for her to see.






We went on a fantastic welly walk with the sun shining and lots of bubbles! The children were using the mud kitchen to cook food for a picnic, going on bug hunts in the long grass and using the cut grass to create mouse houses and forts.

Ash Tree and Oak Tree made the most of the sunshine and have been having snack outside,

using tyres, cable reels and crates as tables and chairs. Well done for another amazing and adventurous week!



It's been an exciting week in Year 1! On Monday the Gruffalo came to visit and we've been learning how to use adjectives to describe him. He promised us an amazing prize if we can show our best independent writing next week! In RE we looked at belonging to different faiths; we had a fascinating time learning about Shabbat, the Jewish day of rest and even experienced an afternoon of being part of the Jewish





community, eating challah bread and drinking juice to replicate the celebratory time. We've also had a wonderful forest school term, where we have been making seed bombs to plant. We've looked at making number sentences in maths and adjectives in English with focus on our handwriting! In computing we were so lucky to have a go at using laptops and learning how to open/close and save a piece of work.



Year 2 have been focusing on the story 'Cinderella of the Nile' for our English writing which we have innovated as a class and we will write our own versions next week. In history, we learnt about the Egyptian Gods and why they were worshipped. To celebrate space week we went to the immersive room to explore our solar system and learn some interesting facts.





Key Stage 2 (Maple, Hazel and Willow) In Year 3, our focus text has





been 'Cinderella of the Nile' which we innovated to 'Rapunzel of the Nile' and we are excited to write our own versions next week! In maths, we have begun looking at 3 digit by 3 digit addition, moving from

practical resources to using our knowledge from last year on column addition and applying this. To celebrate Space Week, we made papier maché

planets; we painted them in the correct colours and have displayed them in the correct order from the sun.

This fortnight we have had some very exciting learning opportunities in our Egyptian topic. We have been looking at the important Egyptian gods and rituals in the afterlife. Willow Tree class have five mummified tomato remains and more still to follow in the coming days. In computing we have been learning about the world wide web and how content can be designed on there and we have really enjoyed exploring a Music Lab and Paintbox. 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#### **School Uniform**

We are starting to see some children wearing items to school—white and lilac cardigans, blue jumpers and grey skirts—which do not comply with our school uniform policy. Please see the reminders below for expected school uniform.

### Children are required to wear:

- A black skirt, pinafore dress, shorts or trousers
- A white polo shirt (with or without the school logo)
- A grey jumper or cardigan with the school logo
- A green gingham summer dress
- Black tights or socks
- Flat black shoes/plain black trainers

#### Measles

Measles cases are rising in England. To date there have been 141 confirmed cases from 1st January – 31st July 2023, more than double the figure for the whole of 2022, with 65% of cases in children under the age of 10 years. In July, UKHSA announced that the risk of large-scale outbreaks is high and cases could rise to between 40k and 160k due to low uptake of the MMR vaccine.



#### **Key messages from NHS**

- Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in an early years setting can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.
- One in five children will require a hospital visit if they become unwell with measles
- One in 15 children develop serious complications from a measles infection, which can include meningitis and blindness
- There is no medical treatment for measles; vaccination is the best protection against becoming seriously unwell
- The Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine is safe and has been used since the early 1980s.
- MMR vaccination is free on the NHS with the first dose being offered when a child is one year and the second at 3 years and 4 months old. This provides long lasting protection against measles, mumps and rubella which can cause long term health conditions such as blindness and asthma.

#### Call to action

- If your child has missed their first or second dose of MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice.
- If you are unsure if your child is due a vaccination or has missed a vaccination, check their red book or contact your GP practice.
- For adults, it is never too late to catch up on any missed MMR vaccinations, contact your GP practice to book an appointment

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#### What parents and carers need to know about Roblox?

Roblox is an online multiplayer gaming platform on which users create their own avatars to play games and explore experiences created by others. While the majority of gaming experiences on Roblox are safe it's important for parents to understand the risks — and how to avoid them.

Here are the nine biggest online threats associated with playing Roblox.:

- **Cyberbullying.** Over 90% of children have experienced or witnessed some form of bullying while playing video games. The anonymous nature of Roblox makes it easy for people to abuse others.
- Online predators luring your child. Roblox includes text messaging and voice chat. This means that children could end up talking with strangers, who may try to lure them into private chats on other platforms.
- **Inappropriate or adult content.** Roblox players can create their own games. The notorious condo games (also known as "scented cons") present a big concern for parents. These spaces often contain virtual strip clubs, naked characters, and users simulating sexually explicit experiences.
- **Games containing simulated violence.** Creators are able to make games in which the goal is to attack other gamers. Players can kill and be killed, often with gratuitous violence, through the use of guns, knives, and bloody fights.
- Online scammers targeting children. Robux is the in-game currency that players use to buy items and upgrades. You can buy Robux with real money or earn virtual currency while playing the game. But many fraudsters run phishing scams to steal Robux or real money from children.

The Pegi rating for Roblox is **7+ years.** However, while Roblox has recommendations that suggest what age groups should play the games, it doesn't automatically apply age verification checks to restrict children from accessing the content so it is recommended that:

- **Set parental controls**: Roblox comes with several parental control options which are explained on the games' website
- Disable private messaging: the game allows parents to disallow messages from anyone not known to their child
- Talk to your child about who they are playing the game with and show them how to block any users who
  are upsetting them or asking uncomfortable questions. Talk to them about what is OK to discuss and what
  they should never share with a stranger online.
