Welcome back! Wow, we have grown again. We now have 205 children on roll. This does impact a few areas of school e.g. parking, club attendance and answering queries, so please be mindful of this. Please walk to school and ensure you book clubs well in advance.

It has been so lovely to all be back in school together again despite the bittersweet end to our first week with the death of the Queen. We will answer any questions from the children sensitively and at an age appropriate level. Thank you children for arriving promptly and quickly settling into your new classes and for bringing in PE kits and arriving with bottles and bags. It has been super to see new friendships developing. Please bring in welly boots and waterproofs if you haven't already done so. A huge thank you to all the parents who attended the Curriculum Evenings. Such a good turn out. We will hold these three times a year and any slides will be shared in class pages on the school website. Please make sure any inhalers or medication come in through the office and not left in book bags as we need to ensure medicine is stored appropriately and safely.

Year 3– a huge well done for settling quickly and arriving to school promptly at 8.45am. We are very excited to open our Key Stage 2. The children have definitely risen to the occasion.

Now that I have been joined by Mr Adkins and Mrs Christmas, our Senior Leadership Team has more capacity. If you have any questions or concerns please continue to go to the class teacher in the first instance, then Key Stage lead or Assistant head teacher. 
<u>Year 3</u> Maple Tree class have had a fantastic start to the new academic year. We have been learning about The Romans which we have linked to our local surroundings.

Helpful Reminders for the Start of the New Academic Year

<u>Water and snacks:</u> Please can we remind parents that your child's water bottle should contain **plain tap** water, not juice, squash or flavoured water. School provides a piece of fruit at break time for all Y2, Y1 and YR. Y3 pupils may bring a piece of fruit from home.

<u>Naming your child's property:</u> Please ensure that your child's name is clearly visible on everything including all clothing, water bottles, shoes and even scooters.

<u>Coats:</u> Please can you make sure your child brings a named waterproof coat and jumper to school EVERY DAY as the weather is very changeable. A Pac-a-Mac can be kept in school if this is any help.

<u>Absence:</u> Swindon Borough Council review our attendance data very closely, with a particular focus on unauthorised absence, and specific action is taken where attendance is below 95%. Any holiday taken in term time will not be authorised and a fine may be issued, particularly if your child already has any unauthorised absence. The only time a child may be absent from school is under exceptional circumstances - cost, employment, extended family illnesses and extended family gatherings are **not** deemed as exceptional circumstances. There are only 190 statutory school days in one year and 175 days (weekends and school holidays) available to use for holidays. Therefore EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS!

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason you should call the school office before 09.00am on the first day of absence. You will need to either provide a return date for your child or contact the office on each morning of your child's absence. Any unexplained absence will be registered as unauthorised. You will be asked to provide proof of appointments.

<u>Drop off and pick up:</u> Year 3 pupils should line up in the playground promptly by 08.45am. For all other years, gates open at 08.45, classroom doors open at 8:50am and close at 8:55am when the register is taken. If you arrive after 9.00am, please come to the main office to sign your child in. We operate a "drop & go" system in the staff car park on Day House Lane from 08.45-8.50 for Year 1-3 (Reception children may use this later in the year). Enter the car park, follow the one way system and stop near the bridge gate. A member of staff opens the car door and takes children across the playground and into their classroom.

The back car park should not be used at pick up or any other time by parents.

Please let the staff member on duty know if your child is going home with someone else. If pick up arrangements change during the day, please advise the office **by midday** We will not let your child go home with anyone we are not expecting to collect or who is not listed as a contact.

Mobile phones: We would ask parents not to use their mobile phones on the school site whilst dropping off or collecting children. As well as being a safeguarding issue, it has a big impact if you greet your child with a smile and take a moment to listen and talk to them at the end of the day.

<u>Packed lunch and allergies:</u> We encourage healthy eating in school and would ask you to refer to the packed lunch policy which has been attached separately. We have some children and staff with allergies in school – to nuts and milk. We are **a nut free school** and no nuts of any kind are to be brought into school. Thank you.

<u>Communication</u> Our main communication method is via email; all newsletters will be emailed out and put on the school website. If you change your email address please let the office know. If your child is new to the school you will also shortly receive details to logon to the Interactive Learning Diary website and "My Child at School" portal.

<u>Birthdays/Celebrations</u> As a healthy school and due to allergies, please could we ask that children do not bring sweets or cakes in for their birthdays. We will celebrate the children's birthdays with them in school and sing to them as a class.



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Travel to school, parking & road safety (please also see the parking promise attached

Thank you to everyone who has made an effort to walk, scoot or cycle to school. As more pupils join the school full time and as the weather deteriorates, we anticipate that the traffic will increase. To ensure the safety of everyone, could we ask that you:

- Consider parking on Homington Avenue and walking the rest of the way to school
- Avoid walking on the path behind parked cars or down the centre of the road
- Please do not block driveways or double park
- Please do not park on corners and prevent a clear view for those crossing the road
- Please do not to park in such a way as to block the road and prevent emergency vehicle access
- Please do not park on the pavement or curbs
- Please do not sit in the parking area with your engine running

Justine Trueman, our local PCSO, carries out frequent parking patrols at drop off and pick up.



Trim Trail

Our new trim trail is a great addition to our playground; it will encourage pupils to be more active and will greatly add to their enjoyment of playtimes. The risk assessment carried out by the Trust's Estate Manager states that the equipment can only be used when school staff are present and only by 15 pupils at a time. As there are no school



staff available to supervise or provide first aid at the start and end of the day we would ask you to please keep children off the trim trail while you are waiting with them in the playground. We are fortunate to be located next to a public playpark and request that children play there at the end or start of the day.

Breakfast and After school Clubs


It has been wonderful to welcome back the children to our Breakfast (Sunrise) and After School (Tree Top) Clubs this term. Places are limited so to ensure that your child has a place and to avoid disappointment, please book your sessions via Parent Pay by **12pm every** Wednesday for the following week. This will enable us to plan for the week ahead.



Breakfast clubs runs from 07.45-08.45 and costs £4 per session per child (last drop off time is 08.30)

After School Club runs from 3pm-4pm and costs £5, or 3pm-5pm costs £8.50 and includes a light snack.

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A message from our Chair of Governors—Tim Owen

Could you support your school community?

Badbury Park Primary, *your* school, has just entered a new phase in its existence. It started life in a mobile classroom and now occupies a very impressive site with 33 staff. But even more importantly, it now has its own Headteacher and a separate Board of Governors. As the school

has developed, the Governing Board has had to grow too. We need more governors, in particular, Parent Governors, and I am inviting all parents to consider – could I be a Governor?

The governing board has a strategic role with three key functions:

- Approving the budget and overseeing the financial performance of the school to make sure money is well spent
- Appointing and holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction

Governors meet a few times a year, are shown information about the school and ask questions. Lots of questions! Questions from a variety of parents with different skills eg health and safety, finance, education, HR, etc. In this way the decisions the school makes are reviewed.

Parent governors play a vital role on governing bodies, holding the unique position of having a parental viewpoint of the school. Through the children, they have a first-hand experience of the delivery of the curriculum, and how the school is perceived from the 'consumers' point of view. If you are interested, talk to someone in the Office, to Mrs Dance, or meet me, Tim Owen and find out how you could be a Governor for your school.
