
Outside, we used our den and construction blocks to build a house for the pigs. We took it in turns to huff and puff and blow the house down!

New term reminders

• **Uniform**: we have noticed a few "rogue" items of clothing worn to school. Children should wear black trousers or black skirt/pinafore dress with a white polo shirt (with or without a logo), and a grey school sweatshirt with logo. Socks, tights and shoes should be also be black. We have a stock of second hand uniform which Friends of Badbury Park are happy to pass on for a small donation.

- Water bottles: please supply your child with a named water bottle every day. This should contain ONLY plain water (not squash, flavoured water or juice).
- **Watches:** children are welcome to wear an analogue watch but please do not send your child to school with a "Fitbit" or a Smart type watch.



- Items from home such as cuddly toys, cars, necklaces and bracelets should not be brought into school. Please check your child's bag before they come to school.
- Internet safety: the age restriction for Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat and YouTube is 13+ and for WhatsApp it is 16. Therefore none of our pupils should be accessing any of these sites.


