Dear Families,

September has gone in a flash! Children have settled into their classes and are feeling happy and comfortable coming to school. As the days are getting shorter and the temperature drops, please don't forget to provide a warm coat and also a hat and gloves (all **named**) as children will go outside every day whatever the weather.

At this time of year we often see an increase in sickness absence—usually just coughs and colds. There have been a couple of Covid cases reported again recently so just a reminder that if your child has a positive Covid test result they should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test. Children who live with someone who has a positive test result should continue to attend as normal.

Thank you for attending the Curriculum evenings and thank you to staff who gave up their time to organise these. We are currently updating our website with all class information and policies so please do take some time to look and see what is going on and how best to support at home. Reading books and phonics/spelling will be coming home with the children shortly. We spend around £3000 on reading books every year and children in our school are privileged to often be the first person to be reading a brand new book; please look after our books so that they can be used for many years to come.

We are in talks with the highways and road safety department at Swindon Borough Council regarding parking which continues to be an issue; our PCSO is also continuing to monitor the situation. I urge you again to walk where you can or park further away and avoid blocking driveways and paths - I do not want to be bringing news of an accident in the future. This really is everyone's responsibility so let's try and fix it together.

It has been a busy week in Apple Tree Class, and all of the children are growing in confidence. We have loved seeing their play develop, even in the short time that they have been with us.

The children have taken the lead in their learning this week and we have been on lots of bear hunts! As the weather has started to change, we have been exploring the signs of autumn. We are making autumn wreaths for our classroom using crunchy leaves and practising our counting skills with conkers.

In class, we are starting each morning with a 'dough disco' session and using 'squiggle whilst you wiggle' to make our hands and fingers strong, ready to be fantastic writers. We are doing lots of fine motor activities like threading and have been so impressed with the focus and resilience the children have shown.

The children have settled nicely into school and have picked up the routines well. This week we have spent time talking about our families and getting to know each other more.







The children have been creating their families and houses using a variety of resources. Take a look at some of their stone families!

We are excited to start teaching our first phonic sounds next week and I'm sure the children will be just as excited to share their new learning with you!

Year 1/2 What a busy week in KS1! We have been developing a range of

skills throughout different lessons - we have continued to describe characters from our story and have learnt about different conjunctions to join our ideas together. We also had the opportunity to use the lpads for the first time this term to research about a chosen animal in Science. In Year 1 this week, we have been comparing numbers using the vocabulary of greater than, less than and equal to. In



Year 2, we have been developing our geographical skills by locating and labelling India on a world map and looking at the other continents around India.

Our welly walk sessions are getting much colder, especially now we are in

and building bug hotels, developing our team building and communication skills.

Year 3 This week Year 3 have been planning a narrative around a picture book called 'Message in a Bottle' by Mark Hunt. They have planned their own character and have looked to reinvent the story

using expanded noun phrases and other wonderful descriptive methods. Our learning of The Romans has continued by studying Boudicca the warrior who stood up against The Roman invasion as well as learning more about Roman

Gods and Goddesses which link to the table names we use in class!


We are concluding our topic of place value and number in Maths and have used our outdoor learning opportunities to consolidate understanding

of comparing numbers. Moving across to Science, we have investigated magnetic and non-magnetic materials, and how magnets can attract and repel depending on the material.
