Nursery: Christmas has arrived in Apple Tree Class! Last week we met Stick Man when he came to visit us





in class, we investigated stick man numbers and built our own 'family tree' outside. This week, we have been finding out about the first Christmas, what happens in winter and making decorations for our classroom.

The children have all worked so hard learning our songs and words for our Christmas songs. We were so proud of how well they coped being in the 'big hall' and performing for lots of people. A massive thank you to all of our amazing parents for your continued support.









Reception

We are so proud of Ash Tree and Oak Tree class this week for their fantastic performances in our Wriggly Nativity. The children sang beautifully and all had lots of fun - thank you for coming to watch it!







As well as practising for our nativity we have been very busy with lots of Christmas activities. We have been making Christmas cards, decorating the tree, writing letters to the cheeky elf and learning how to make paper chains and snowflakes.



<u>Year 1/2</u> Over the past two weeks, Years 1 and 2 have been working hard on our Batik art project. We evaluated existing Indian art pieces and then we used these for inspiration to create some of our favourite designs. After drawing some designs, we picked our favourite one to design our batik art piece and then put the wax onto fabric tjanting tool. For our DT project, 'making a simple samosa', we evaluated samosas. Some of us didn't like the smell of these or the look, but some of us thought they were very tasty!





We also began computing this week and worked in partners to play a quiz game on Kahoot to show us another way that technology is used.

We are excited to show Year 1s how to do this next week and work with them to explore a picture app on the lpads.



In Forest School this week we created Christmas works of art from nature—we made "snowmen" with logs and leaves and even found a frozen puddle to make a beautiful centrepiece with conkers and pine cones.



Year 3: Over the past few weeks, Maple Tree Class have been beginning their child -led projects which has been focused on board games. The children have used their teria in English to learn about instructions and explanations



topic in English to learn about instructions and explanations so they can apply those skills when creating instructions for their very own board game. To ensure instructions are clear, we have looked at time conjunctions and imperative verbs to see how they can help make rules easy to understand.



In Maths, we have finalised learning about column addition and subtraction using exchanging. Children have used Base 10 resources as well as counters to gain a concrete understanding of the process of exchanging before answering reasoning and

problem-solving question. We have also looked into land use in the UK, building on from the Romans aspect of our topic to see how they have influenced urban and rural areas across the UK.

Finally, it has been a great joy to see the hard work every child has put in this Autumn term and the great progress they have made in their learning. A big well done to the children of Maple Tree Class!



Road Safety

Pupil safety outside schools has been prominent in the local news recently and we are aware of a "near miss" outside our own school. Globally, around 186 300 children under 18 years die from road traffic crashes annually, and road traffic injuries are the leading killer of children aged 15-17 years worldwide. Two times as many boys as girls die in road traffic crashes.

To keep children safe if you are walking:

- hold your child's hand don't let them run ahead ~
- look out for and encourage your child to be aware of hidden entrances or driveways crossing the payement
- make sure your child walks on the inside of the pavement, away from the traffic, and avoid walking behind parked cars outside the front of school

If you are driving:

- reverse into the drop off space
- do not to park across resident's driveways, even for a few minutes
- avoid parking on the pavements or corners and do not park in such a way as to block the road and prevent emergency vehicle access

Attendance reminders


Attendance has a direct link to attainment. Achieving at school builds a child's self-esteem, as well as enhancing their prospects. Attending school and being part of the school's community gives a child a sense of belonging and promotes their social development and if a child is not in school regularly, they are not fully accessing the curriculum and learning opportunities available to them. Our school attendance levels are reported every week to the Trust and Swindon Borough Council and are very carefully monitored. As a school we are always striving to meet or exceed the national average of 96% Attendance percentage per class for the first two terms:

Apple Tree	92%
Ash Tree	92%
Oak Tree	93%
Beech Tree	93%
Pine Tree	95%
Yew Tree	97%
Maple Tree	95%



You will be informed of your child's individual attendance next week as part of the Pupil update Cards and letters will be sent out where there is concern. Please note we do not authorise any holidays; several families have already received a fixed penalty notice from Swindon Borough Council as a result of unauthorised holiday.

There are only 190 school days each year which leaves 175 days not at school for shopping and holidays !

Admissions policy and Consultation

The Blue Kite Academy Trust now comprises of 11 Swindon Schools (Infant, Junior and primary) and a new admission policy has been written to incorporate all the schools within the Trust. As a result it is necessary to consult on this policy for 6 weeks between the dates of 1 October and 31 January.

The BKAT admission policy for 2024/2025 has not significantly changed any of the original individual school policies. There is one change of PAN and this is for Colebrook Infant school. It has been agreed with Swindon School Admissions that this will reduce from 50 to 30. The consultation will run from Wednesday 30 November to Tuesday 31 January 2023.
