


Apple Tree class have been doing lots of outdoor learning this week. We have done our first welly walks onto the field.

We have been reading 'Kipper's Birthday' and made a birthday cake for the whole class. We carefully weighed and mixed the ingredients before the adults took it to bake. We sang ourselves 'Happy Birthday' and shared our cake together. It was delicious!





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
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Reception:











It is Road Safety awareness week and we spoke about the importance of crossing the road carefully. We remembered three key things...Stop, Look and Listen! During explore and learn, some children made busy roads and used their "mini me's" to show how to carefully cross the road.

Ash tree and Oak tree have been very busy learning the songs for our nativity - remember costumes need to given to the teacher by Friday 1st December

KS1 Year 1 have been very busy this week. They have all made and decorated their own Gingerbread Man. Last week the children enjoyed a wet welly walk to Coate Water. We stopped along the way marking different landmarks on our own maps.







Year 2 have been writing busy writing their own Ancient Egyptian flatbread recipes. In Maths, we are learning about money and the children have used the outside area for problem solving activities e.g. how much money is



there altogether? We have also been working hard on our art projects. The children have explored line and tone, then applied this to draw hieroglyphics. They have planned, drawn, painted and evaluated their own cartouche including their name, in a similar way to those that were painted on the walls in the era of Ancient Egypt.





<u>KS2</u> Year 3 loved taking part in our Odds Socks Day for anti-bullying week and Children in Need burpee challenge last week! In maths, we have been looking at money and I think we might have some budding bankers among uswatch this space! In English, we have been writing some delicious recipes, inspired by our Ancient Egyptian bread making. In geography, we have been looking at sketch maps in preparation for our walk to map out our local area.





This week, Year 4 have been intrepid reporters. They have been 'covering' a scandal from Ancient Egypt. There has been an attempted assassination on a young pharaoh and Year 4 have been responsible for that breaking news. In maths, we have been investigating the relationship between multiplication and division facts. We had an exciting and energetic Spanish lesson this week when we had to follow instructions and directions to make some PE moves. In PSHE we have been learning to speak out and stay safe with the NSPCC. Ask your child to recall the number for Childline and explore! This week's RE looked at the Beatitudes and we represented what these mean in our outdoor learning.

Admissions Policy

The Blue Kite Academy School now comprises of 13 Swindon Schools (Infant, Junior and Primary) and a new admission policy for 2025/2026 has been written to incorporate the two schools that joined the Trust on 1 November 2023; Oaktree Nursery and Primary School and Covingham

Park Primary School. There is also one change of Pupil Admission Numbers (PAN) and this is for Catherine Wayte Primary School where it will reduce from 60 to 45.

As a result of these changes, it is necessary to consult on this policy—please find attached to your email. The consultation will run from Wednesday 22 November 2023 to Wednesday 31 January 2024.
