Communication regarding curriculum, progress and attainment

As a school we have three curriculum meetings per year where we set out the curriculum and the year group learning expectations. Once a term there is an 'Open house' opportunity to see books and the class room. Across the year parents are also invited into workshops and a 'performance'. Each term parents receive either a parents evening invite or a 'progress update card'. We share progress, attainment, attendance and things you can do to support at home.

We send out bi weekly newsletters about all the things the children are doing with an updated yearly calendar that was shared in September. Our website site is up to date and we send a bi weekly email update. There are class pages on our website which give you time tables and key information. All workshop slides are added here and our curriculum overviews and skills can also be found in the curriculum areas. We also share little celebrations on social media including face book, twitter and Instagram. We send texts and emails for messages where plans may change at the last moment. Teachers are available at the start and end of the day and meetings can be booked via the office for longer conversations. with hot chocolate afterwards.














What an exciting day we had in the snow on Wednesday; listening to the crunchy snow under our feet and building snowmen... it was a bit chilly!









This week in the Maple Tree Class we have taken advantage of the unusual but fun snow that has arrived. The children used this as an opportunity to experiment with the snow by comparing snowflakes, building igloos, and creating snowball games. This learning then inspired poetry within our English lesson where the children wrote acrostic and repetition poems. In Maths, we are beginning to learn to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number starting with the help of place value charts and pictorial support before moving into abstract calculations. For science, we have started learning about Rocks and Soils which feeds well into our topic of What Lies Beneath. The children looked at different types of rocks and how we can categorise them into groups based on their appearance.
