

This week we have been looking at adventures. As a class, we voted for our favourite stories. One of our favourites is 'You Choose'. We have been learning to look at the pictures and ask questions about our favourite parts of the story. In our small world area, we have been using props to retell stories using our own words.





We have enjoyed a couple of sunny afternoons and enjoyed our welly walk. Some of the children worked hard to make fairy wands to make magic spells and we made a friendship potion as a class.





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Reception

We started our new topic 'What's Beyond the Stars?' with a trip to the immersive room so we could go to space and see the planets, moon and stars. Then

we learnt about astronauts and what they need to wear and why they float in space. The children thought of some fantastic questions to ask an astronaut and enjoyed seeing them make sandwiches in their space shuttle. We even had moon

sand to explore that Miss Hatton brought back from her trip to space!

The children have been doing some excellent maths this week, counting forwards and backwards to 20 and making their own addition and subtraction number sentences. Finally we turned our outside learning area into a space galaxy - doesn't it look beautiful!








Year 1/2: Beech Tree class have been learning all about Habitats in Science. We went on a walk around the school and onto the field and spotted

loads of animals home, including a toad that had lost it's way from the stream into a plant pot. We then had a great forest school session creating our own animal habitats.



In Pine Tree Class we have been busy

exploring 'time'. We have learnt about the hands on the clock and how to tell the time to the hour and half past. It has been lovely to get outside and do some maths in the Spring sunshine! In history we have begun learning about Mary Anning. The children have been researching why she is a significant







We have been busy enjoying our learning outside with the unpredictable weather over the past 2 weeks! In maths we have been learning to find fractions of shapes and learning to tell the time. We have been able to identify quarters, halves and thirds. In forest school we looked at habitats and made our own using natural resources.





Year 3:

Children in Maple Tree class have returned from the Easter break with lots of wonderful learning. They had the visit from Dr Pringle and Susie as part of the Wild Escape workshop. Here they were able to look at and discuss different types of creatures and the habitats they would explore. From this they produced various types of artistic drawing or clay work. In English, we have been exploring persuasive adverts by studying examples of adverts you would see on posters and TV. This has given the children an opportunity to evaluate adverts, create their own TV adverts and then perform



them to their peers. Some children may be candidates for an Oscar! In Maths, we have learnt about perimeter by identifying what perimeter is, how we measure it and how we calculate it. In History, we have begun a new topic focused on the Stone Age period. The children have loved this so far as they have been learning about life in the Palaeolithic and Mesolithic. We have looked into similarities and differences during these periods of history looking at images of artefacts and our interpretation of them.



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
The Blue Kite Art Exhibit

Using the theme of 'Journey' as the focus, schools considered how they might interpret this and bring it to life within the various elements of art studied across each Year Group.

ICT parent workshop

As our digital lives continue to grow, we know that for young people, spending an increasing amount of time online holds lots of potential risks and concerns.

To allow you to help your children navigate themselves through their ever rapidly growing digital lives, whilst at the same time allowing them to be independent digital users, we are running a special live, online safety presentation on Tuesday 2nd May at 3pm in school.



We know that many feel overwhelmed trying to keep up with the constant evolution of games, apps and social media platforms and are quite often understandably worried about, cyber-bullying, online grooming and what they are sharing online.

During this 90min session, Richard from The Stay Safe Initiative CIC will be helping you to understand your children's digital lives a bit more. Exploring what they are doing online, understanding the risks, and providing straight forward help and advice to keep everyone at home safe. This session has been designed purely to provide you with as much information as possible, to allow you to make informed decisions and choices. Not to judge or tell parents how to be parents. Richard will be happy to stay around for as much time as needed after the presentation to help address any of your individual questions and comments should you have any.

Children can stay in their classroom with their teachers if you are attending the workshop in the hall. If you are unable to attend in person, an online link will be made available; please collect you child as normal from school before joining the online session.

Thank you to everyone who joined Mr Adkins, Mrs Christmas and Mrs Humphries in a walk to Coate Water and back in very rainy conditions as part of our Fundraising efforts for schools in The Gambia. This represents the length of journey that some children complete every day in the Gambia to get to their school (approx. 3K).





We were waved off by Neil Griffiths who founded Project Gambia in 2003 following a visit during which he fell in love with the Gambian people and their culture.

We have raised £225 so far from our sponsored walk (with special mention to Dalton and Skyler for single handedly raising £100 and £45 respectively! - Well done both of you!). Please pay any outstanding sponsorship money into your child's ParentPay account by 5th May and if you were unable to accompany us on the walk yesterday you can still donate on Parentpay under the "Sponsored Walk" section. Every penny that gets donated or raised for the charity goes towards the education of children in The Gambia. All promotion, advertising, trips, and expenses are paid for by the volunteers at Project Gambia, so you can be safe in the knowledge that anything you donate will go directly towards improving the lives of pre-school children in The Gambia.

Badbury pupils also attended a joint online assembly with all the schools in the Blue Kite Trust this morning to learn about what different fundraising events have been taking place in other schools; the fundraising total so far raised by Blue Kite Trust schools is £5000.

Thank you also for attending our table top and cake sale today—it was well attended and a great success thanks to the organisation by Mrs Magiera. We will update you with the total raised next week.
